Taking part in activities that are based on Scottish Gaelic culture can make learning active and experiential, and achieve outcomes across the whole curriculum as well as addressing current environmental issues. 'Ar Tir' is about exploring the local environment and discovering our relationship with it (past, present, and future).

- Promote learning through Scottish and Gaelic Culture.

Have you ever wondered what everyday life was like in Scotland's past? 'Clan Craft' will give you some of the skills that our ancestors used on a daily basis, particularly during the time of the clans. From the pursuit of food and warmth to discovering our surroundings there is something for everyone.

Activities:

Activities will be related to the different roles within the clan system. The Tacksman (protector), Cottar (provider), Chief (land) and Bard (stories/song).

- · Shelter homes of the people
- · Rope everyday tasks
- · Fire- practical and supersticious
- · Ceilidh story, song, poetry
- · Land plant/tree and animal identification/tracking
- · Gaelic connection with our surroundings

OUTCOMES

- · the pronunciation of some basic Gaelic words and their meanings.
- · common native plant and tree identification and their practical uses dyes, crafts, stories etc.
- about traditional skills (depending on season and location) such as thatching, making natural cordage, fire building/ lighting, storytelling, crofting.
