WOODLAND LEARNING COORDINATOR, RSPB LOCH LEVEN, 04/12/12 - 30/06/13 (FIXED TERM CONTRACT)

I plan and deliver outdoor learning sessions for primary schools in the Perth Academy cluster at Quarrymill Woodland Park in Perth. I work closely with teachers to design a series of outdoor learning experiences appropriate to age, stage and curricular outcomes. I also contribute to the work of the Life Long Learning team at RSPB Loch Leven. This includes facilitating school visits to the reserve, family and holiday events and Forest School sessions.

OUTDOOR LEARNING FACILITATOR, HARMENY EDUCATION TRUST LTD, BALERNO - 06/01/08 - 01/12/12

As an Outdoor Learning Facilitator I supported pupils education by providing learning experiences in the outdoors related to classroom learning. I planned and delivered these sessions on a daily basis with Curriculum for Excellence outcomes in mind. I ran extra sessions for high school students and after school clubs such as 'Nature Watch', 'Bushcraft' and 'Photography Club'. During school holidays I provided activities for children on a residential placement, this ranged from mountain biking to overnight camping trips. I often planned and delivered sessions for individual children and their families, volunteers, staff team development and for external clients.

RESIDENTIAL CHILDCARE WORKER, HARMENY EDUCATION TRUST LTD - AUG 06 - JAN 08

Providing care for young people with social, emotional, and behavioral difficulties. This included general day-to-day care and support throughout the school day. I also acted as a keyworker for one child, working with his parents, teacher, and social worker to achieve the goals of his care plan and resilience report. This involved recording progress and writing reports. During this time I was responsible for planning and running group work with the young people under our care and supporting Harmeny Outdoors during holidays. I worked closely with a team of approximately eight care workers.

ACTIVITIES COORDINATOR, BRAENDAM FAMILY HOUSE, THORNHILL - AUG 04 - SEP 05

My main role was to plan and deliver activities for families living with the effects of poverty. Families came to us for respite care and some had not been in the countryside before. I planned activities that they could enjoy as a family and perhaps be accessed in the future by using free resources such as the Countryside Ranger Service. I was responsible for supervising and training volunteers. We usually had a team of 8 or so volunteers from all over the world with whom I lived with and supported throughout their placement. I often planned activities that could be an important experience for both families and volunteers.

HEAD COUNCELLOR, NEW LONDON COUNTY 4-H CAMP, CONNECTICUT, USA, MAY TO SEP - 01 - 04
During this time I held positions as Counsellor, Canoe Instructor/Lifeguard, Waterfront
Director, and Head Councellor.

As Counsellor I was responsible for a group of 12 or so young people aged between 7 and 16 during their summer camp stay. This included their day-to-day care, general play activities, running canoe and swimming lessons, and planning evening activities. As Waterfront Director I was responsible for all water-based activity at the camp. This meant ensuring staff were properly trained in the activity they taught and aware and practiced in emergency procedures. The camp was inspected each year by state health authorities and a lot of my



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work was in preparing for this and filling the relevant paperwork. As Head Counsellor I worked as part of the camp management team. I helped hire staff early on in the season then designed and delivered some of the induction-training programme.
